

## DPW REPORT FOR THE MONTH OF APRIL 2016

- Sanded streets as needed.
- Picked up weeds, leaves, tree limbs and other yard waste that was put out to curbs by village residents. Last day for pick up will be May 15<sup>th</sup>.
- Did water, sanitary sewer and storm sewer locates as needed.
- Cleaned off tops of Storm Sewer Catch Basins as needed.
- DPW Personnel worked on the Village Emergency Operations Plan for Water Distribution.
- Finished racking out and picking up sod that was plowed up on sides of roadways and sidewalks during winter plowing.
- Put topsoil and seed in areas around village where damage occurred from winter plowing.
- Swept all village streets with street sweeper.
- Update on the Water Main loop from North First Street to North Second Street: Right of Ways have been granted by owners of properties. Project plans have been reviewed and approved by the Cattaraugus County Health Department. Will be doing some exploratory digging and the project is planned to be started the first week in May.
- Replaced three 10 inch water main valves and a water service connection in front of Water Well House #2
- Added a 10 inch Water Main Meter in pit on the West End of Village for the water main that feeds the west end of Town of Allegany Water District. Also added a post and an electronic box near pit for electricity and future SCADA hookup.
- Worked on the boat and kayak launch area near the Town Park. Installed cement slabs for garbage cans, recyclable bins, picnic tables and kayak storage rack. Placed and bolted aforesaid items to cement. Cleared small trees and brush in area along river, bulldozed area with town bulldozer, added some top soil and grass seed was put down in area with the Peterson Landscaping hydro seeder machine. Dennis Peterson from Peterson Landscaping volunteered his labor and personnel labor, donated his hydro seeder to put seed down and some of his equipment to assist in grading area.
- Employees attended Work Place Violence and Bloodborne Pathogen Training.
- Unclogged a sewer main on Clarence Street.
- Trustee Cummins and Superintendent Papasergi took a representative from National Solar Technologies around all village buildings and water sewer facilities to get estimates on planning for possible solar power in future.
